She earned her **Master of Arts in Teaching** from **Harvard University**, and as a member of the first Canada Corps, she served in Ukraine as an election observer for the repeat presidential election run-off in the winter of 2004. It is only natural that Ellen serves as **Peace and Security Critic** in the Green Party of Canada Shadow Cabinet.

In all of Ellen's activities, from representing her school with the **Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation**, working as a writer and with other writers in the **Professional Writers Association of Canada**, facilitating professional development with teachers, and most recently knocking on doors for the Green Party of Canada, her focus has been on *building communities in which people can work together for the greater good*.

Ellen has been a member of the **Professional Writers Association of Canada** for over 20 years.

Ellen was a classroom teacher with the **Toronto District School Board** for many years, serving her community as the local **Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation** representative.

After retiring in June 2006, Ellen spent ten months on a fellowship with public school teachers in Greenland, where she witnessed the effects of climate change first-hand. Ellen then spent the month of June 2008 in Central America, working with English teachers in Guatemala and volunteering with a nonprofit organization in Nicaragua.

Ellen and her husband treasure their time with their grandchildren, who motivate them to work for a healthy, sustainable world.
